FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9:6

One of my favorite secular Christmas songs has always been the original Bing Crosby version of "I'll Be Home for Christmas." While the lyrics are hope-filled, the tune has a deep sense of longing, to the point of melancholy. We hear this sentiment in the lyrics "I'll be home for Christmas...if only in my dreams." The song, first released on October 26, 1943, was written from the perspective of a young soldier writing home from overseas in the midst of World War II. The song addresses the tension between the excitement of returning home for the holidays and the uncertainty that the singer will actually make it back home in time to be with family.

Isn't this tension between excitement and anxiety relatable? On one hand, we may be excited to return home for the holidays, while on the other, there may be a touch of sadness through the realization that the nostalgia of the season is simply not to be. The season of Advent is an invitation. For many, it is the invitation to get into the Christmas spirit, to count down the days to the grand celebration, and to let the holiday transform everything around us. But there is a deeper and more profound invitation being offered in the season of Advent. The invitation is to remember that we are heading for home. Or if we're not, if we've forgotten that there is a home toward which to head, it is the invitation to long for the home we call the kin-dom of God. It is where family resides, where peace resides, where justice abides, and hope will rise.

This December we are inviting you to "Come Home for Christmas" through our sermon series, seasonal gatherings, and worship services. While not everyone has the same warm feelings of returning back to their ancestral homes, this season we are inviting EVERYONE to join the LPUMC church family where peace, justice, and hope reside. Here at LPUMC, we are about Christmas, the Mass of Christ, the celebration of the Incarnate One who comes to remind us that we are not alone, and God is with us. We are about the longing for the coming kin-dom, where we will study war no more, where people will walk in the light, where joy will be found, and love will be the tie that binds us together. That's the home for which we long. That's the invitation this Advent season to our church and the world: "Come home for Christmas." Will you join us during this season of anticipation, for the hope that is to come?
