Greetings of peace and blessings in the name of Christ Jesus,

It gives me great joy to announce that, as of July 1, Bishop Karen Oliveto has appointed me to serve the community of Longmont, pastoring alongside you, the beloved family of Longs Peak United Methodist Church. I guess you're stuck with me for another year! This fills me with great joy, as I feel we are on the precipice of revitalizing our church with new and exciting ministries. You may have heard that a women's retreat is in the works for this fall. LPUMC has hired a new pianist, whom you will be meeting later this month. The board is working on filling two new job descriptions: one for a program director, and another for someone to help boost our online presence and experience. We have some great ideas in the works to help grow and sustain the future of LPUMC so that some of our best days are yet to come!

As you likely know, I have just returned from the Mountain Sky Annual Conference held this past week in Casper, WY. This is the annual gathering of delegates from each of our churches in Colorado, Utah, Montana, and Wyoming, and it's always a joy to reconnect with old friends and colleagues. In fact, it was a personal blessing for Lee and I to share an Airbnb house with Steve Easterday-McPadden! (By the way, he sends his love and greetings to LPUMC!) With over 15+ years of annual conferences under my belt, I have to say that this was the first conference I have experienced that had a palpable sense of levity as, for the first time, the denomination truly leans into the tagline adopted in 2001, of Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors, with the removal of the harmful language in the Book of Discipline towards the LGBTQ community. The conference modeled an inclusive community in which everyone has a place at the table as we gathered and worshiped alongside Arapaho and Cheyenne descendant survivors of the Sand Creek Massacre, members of the Tongan, Black, and Asian congregations, and delegates of every spectrum of economic background, age, gender, mental health, physical ability, race, and sexuality. What connected each person was a desire to live into God's grace to create a space where we all belong together, and once we got to the voting, the delegation illustrated and leaned into John Wesley's value of "though we may not think alike, may we not love alike?" The conference proved that unity does not mean uniformity, but together we all belong. I am proud to say that as a United Methodist, it's by God's grace alone that we as the church are one in Christ!

This 2024 Mountain Sky Annual Conference also marked Bishop Karen Oliveto's eighth

and final year as a bishop before entering into retirement. Consequently, later this month, the Western Jurisdiction will appoint a new bishop to our Mountain Sky Conference. I will keep you apprised of developments and resources as our conference welcomes our new bishop. Beloved church, thank you for being a true church family. I have always felt that LPUMC embodies radical hospitality at its very core. This was evident early this spring when a young homeless man joined us for worship on a Sunday morning. During his visit, I witnessed you—the church—warm, feed, clothe, and welcome him. You gave him not only tangible items but also the dignity of feeling that he mattered and belonged in our community. Well done, Church!

Housed at the Longmont Church of Christ on Collyer St, Hopelight Medical Clinic provides low cost or free primary care in an outpatient setting. The clinic provides family medicine care for all members of the family. Their goal is to develop ongoing relationships between their patients and Hopelight; and to be a compassionate medical provider for members of the greater Longmont community who are uninsured, are on Medicaid / Medicare, or do not have access to other providers regardless of their background, creed or beliefs. This includes young adults, families with children, and adults with chronic diseases.

Updates from the Board meeting from June 12, 2024.

A huge thank you to all of you who attended the June Town Hall meeting. We feel it was a remarkable success and hope to hold more of these to keep you informed and get your feedback. A special thanks to Margorie Hanson, who took the time to collate all your responses to make it easier for board members to review.

Our Spiritual formation for this month was on listening to God during prayer and more follow-up on those things that God places on your heart. Acts of care, concern, and innovation may all be calls from God for action- be open to these nudges. Thank you, Phil, for leading this discussion.

Thanks to John, who led us through continued discussion on the book "Canoeing the Mountains;" these chapters (11-12) discussed relationships and resistance. How to manage and embrace both.

We spent much of our time in discussion of the outcomes of the General Conference and how that affects our personal community. We acknowledge that we are an open and affirming community but realize that not all will eagerly embrace this change. As such we are going to proceed slowly with signage (both on the church window and on-line platforms) to indicate this.
